Neighborhood Assistance

The Neighborhood Resource Center provides customized assistance to communities throughout Colorado. This assistance can range from brief phone consultations to intensive local programs. NRC helps residents and associations resolve local issues to strengthen communities.

NRC publishes written materials that are also available on our website (www.nrc-neighbor.org) with useful information for neighborhoods. In 2006 we hosted the 8th statewide Colorado Neighborhoods Conference and Celebration to help neighborhood activists obtain expanded knowledge and skills.

Good Neighboring Project

NRC's Good Neighboring Project promotes neighborhood cohesiveness, safety and harmony block-to-block. Now in its 10th year, the project encourages residents to host block parties or work on block activities that improve relationships with their neighbors.

In 2006 we promoted Good Neighboring statewide. We distributed 1800 party paks, providing free ice cream and other supplies. We also awarded 85 Micro grants of \$100 to jump-start block projects throughout the state, predominantly in the metro area.

Through the first 9 years of the program we have sponsored more than 12,800 block parties, involving more than 400,000 people.

Neighborhood Problem-Solving

Over the years, the Neighborhood Resource Center has helped train law enforcement officers and community members on how to establish strong partnerships that work to reduce and prevent crime in neighborhoods.

During 2006 we continued to provide technical assistance to the police and alumni of the problem-solving process. Upon request we conducted neighborhood problem-solving workshops.

Community Building

The Neighborhood Resource Center works in more than 15 neighborhoods on intensive, long-term efforts to improve the quality of life for local residents.

In 2006 we continued our work as a Mile High United Way agency partner to distribute grant funds in four neighborhoods, and with Denver's H&NDS agency to provide technical assistance to 19 neighborhoods. We also assisted The Denver Foundation with its long-term neighborhood assistance efforts.
